SUBJECT: Administration of the Organized Reserve Corps.


TO : Each Member of the Officers and Enlisted Reserve Corps.

1. The Commanding General, Army Service Forces, has been designated by the War Department as the agent responsible for the administration of Organized Reserve affairs (including the individual members of the Officers Reserve Corps and the Enlisted Reserve Corps) during the period of demobilization and until the reorganization of the postwar Army of the United States has been completed. The Commanding General, ASF, has delegated the responsibility for the administration of Organized Reserve affairs in the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee to the Commanding General, Fourth Service Command, whose headquarters is located in Atlanta, Georgia. The Fourth Service Command has been organized into seven military areas for Reserve purposes.

2. The headquarters of the North Carolina Military Area is located at Raleigh, North Carolina. Since your permanent residence of record is within the State of North Carolina, your Reserve Corps records have been transferred to this headquarters. For Organized Reserve purposes you are under the jurisdiction of this headquarters.

3. The State of North Carolina has been organized into three military districts. See reverse side of this letter for location and address of district headquarters and list of counties within the territory allotted to each military district.

4. Military district headquarters have been established in order to render assistance locally to each member of the Organized Reserve Corps on all matters pertaining to the Organized Reserve including assistance in scheduling and conducting meetings for groups of Reserve personnel located in your vicinity. You are urged, therefore, to communicate with the commanding officer of the military district within which your address is located in order to keep informed and participate in the activation and reorganization of the new Organized Reserve Corps.


and have not received notice of your promotion in the ORC during the six months following, you should forward a copy of the order promoting you in the AUS, which you received from the separation center, to this headquarters where an endeavor will be made to effect corresponding promotion in the ORC.

5. There is at present no authority to include female personnel, flight officers, or warrant officers in the Organized Reserves, therefore no application for appointment or enlistment from these categories will be processed. In the near future, examining boards to process applicants for the Officers Reserve Corps will be in operation, and will process applications of flight officers and warrant officers.

6. Individuals rated as pilots, observers, flight surgeons, parachutists, combat infantrymen, etc., at the time of separation will be permitted to retain their rating under current War Department Directives.

7. The War Department has not announced a policy regarding flying time for members of the Air Corps Reserve.

SUBJECT: Information Memorandum.

TO: Each Member Officers and Enlisted Reserve Corps Residing
in North Carolina.

1. Army extension courses are being revised by the War Department and it is hoped that they will be completed soon. You will be informed which courses you should complete to qualify for re-appointment and/or promotion, as the case may be, as soon as such information becomes available. It is hoped that you will take full advantage of these courses as soon as they become available.

2. There is at present no training program published for the reservists, either commissioned or enlisted. However, as reserve activities progress, the basic plan for organization will be supplemented by training directives. This should not, however, limit your activities as far as group meetings for stimulating interest are concerned. These meetings are encouraged and your district headquarters will endeavor to furnish instructors and training data including films of such classes as may be available when desired. You are encouraged to call on your district headquarters for any information and assistance in keeping up the interest of all reservists in your locality. You will receive instructions as to training from your district headquarters, and all correspondence on this subject will be directed to your District Commander. Correspondence regarding administrative matters (such as change of address, promotions, etc.) will be directed to the North Carolina Military Area headquarters, since all records are kept here.

3. (a) Some officers are requesting recall to active duty. This headquarters has been advised that it is the policy of the War Department not to recall to active duty an officer relieved under the point system (RR1-5) unless there is a requisition by the military agency for an officer to fill a vacancy which can not be adequately filled by one now on active duty.

(b) At the present time enlisted reservists will not be called to active duty at their own request. They may, however, re-enlist in the Regular Army under current regulations which may be obtained at the nearest Recruiting Station.

4. Some officers who have been relieved from active duty were eligible by length of time in grade and efficiency index, for promotion in the AUS upon reporting at separation center for relief from active duty and have failed to receive such promotion. They accepted appointment in the ORC in the grade and section in which then serving. Most of these cases have been reviewed and the officers meeting the eligibility requirements have subsequently been promoted. In the event you are one of these affected officers,
